CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS

Clubs and student organizations are a vital part of Texas Middle School, and students are encouraged to become involved. The goal of all clubs and extracurricular organizations at Texas Middle School is to help each student become involved and realize his/her potential.

ART CLUB
