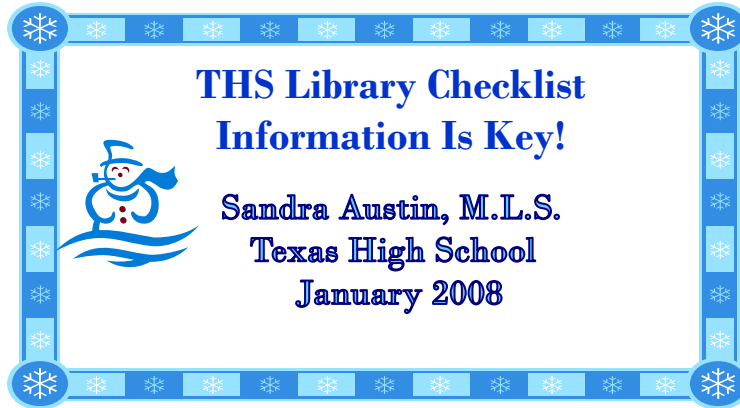

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. King was born January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia. He was a graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta. Dr. King was a minister and one of the most well-known civil rights activists of the 20th Century, often aided in his life's work by his wife Coretta Scott King. His legacy of nonviolent response to conflict and ardent support of social justice for all ethnicities is still vibrant among many people of today. Dr. King dreamed of equality of education, economics, and social standing for all racial groups. On April 4, 1968 Dr. Martin Luther King lost his life in Memphis, Tennessee, assassinated, while still in his battle to create social change for the improvement of life for everyone.
