Texarkana, TX – Wake Village Elementary School 3rd Grade student, Tylicia Crutchfield, wanted to bring her fictional character, “Nosey Rosey,” to life. With the help of her grandmother she was able to accomplish that but in doing so she also brought to life an opportunity to be published.

On Tuesday, February 22 at Noon, representatives from PublishAmerica will visit Tylicia at her school to sign her to a contract to produce a children’s book, *Nosey Rosey*.

“I like writing,” the quite spoken new author commented. “My grandmother does it and I want to be just like her.” Tylicia’s grandmother is Suzanna Carr, an author also under contract with PublishAmerica Publishing Company. Carr’s book, *The Mansfield Curse*, is currently being made into a movie.

The tale of *Nosey Rosey* is of a young girl who is very curious about all the things around her. One day, her investigative nature leads Rosey to find a baby bird on the playground that has broken its wing. She takes the bird to the vet and in time helps the baby bird heal and learn to fly on its own.
